Public Comments (Agenda item #3)

- Robert Cavage spoke from the Wildfire Research Network (wildfireresearch@yahoo.com).
- Saul Salka spoke about the property on Wilshire and Federal and that he would like it to become a Jewish Home for the Aging. There will be hearings on September 11th and 12th.

• Alan Fine discussed the Treasurer's Report. Alan moved to accept the Treasurer's Report. Scott Harper seconded. Motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Mayor's Office Report (Agenda item #6)

• Stephen Cheung is the new representative from the Mayor to the BABCNC.

Council District #5 Report (Agenda item #7)

- Sonia Kwon introduced herself as the new Field Deputy of Council District #5 covering the Laurel Canyon area.
- Joan Pelico will be the new Field Deputy for the rest of our NC area, and has been with CD 5 since March.

DONE Report (Agenda item #8)

- Deanna announced an Orientation for new board members on September 20th at 7 p.m. at the IMAN Cultural Center.
- The NC Congress will meet at the Convention Center on 10/28 from 6-7:00 p.m.
- The Mayor's Budget Day will be on 10/13. Ron Galperin will represent the BABCNC at this event.

Bylaws/Rules Committee (Item #9)

• Larry Leisten distributed copies of a motion that had been emailed out and moved that the Council approve holding its Annual Meeting in January of each calendar year, at which it elects its officers, so that At-Large Members, elected following the Council's December meeting, may participate in the election of Council officers. Parliamentarian Joshua Berman confirmed that 72 hours advance notice is needed for motions regarding Bylaws changes. Larry withdrew his motion.

- Larry moved to approve the Form of Declaration in support of petition referenced under proposed Article 4.5 of BABCNC Bylaws. The motion was seconded. Discussion was held. Motion defeated.
- Larry moved to amend Article 4.5 of the Bylaws to remove the prohibition against overlapping boundaries. The motion was seconded. Discussion was held. Motion defeated.

Planning and Land Use Committee (Agenda Item #10)

- Carol Sidlow moved to support 1051 Seabury Lane, with an EIR and no waving of the rules. Vicki seconded. Motion
 passed by voice vote.
- Marcia Selz moved to oppose changes to the Wilshire Community Plan without the benefit of a full environmental
 review, public hearings and community participation, and to oppose any process that seeks to circumvent the
 residents in regards to changing zoning restrictions, and that the BABCNC encourage our elected and appointed
 officials to respect the integrity of Community Plans, their goals and purpose. Ron Hudson seconded. Discussion
 was held. There was a call for the question, which passed. The motion passed by voice vote.
- Carol moved that BABCNC oppose exemptions to the Hillside Ordinance with respect to improving the roadway to 20' and inadequate ingress and egress at 9945 W. Beverly Grove/1300 N. Beverly Grove. Scott seconded. Discussion was held. Motion passed by voice vote.

Motion to Accept Lookout Mountain Alliance into BABCNC Membership (Agenda Item #11)

 Carol Sidlow moved that the Lookout Mountain Alliance be accepted into the BABCNC and be entitled to have one representative. John Amato seconded. Discussion was held. Pam Cooke moved to table this motion until next meeting. The motion was seconded. Vote on the motion to table: Yes: 10 votes, No: 13 votes. Motion to table defeated. There was a call for the question on the motion regarding acceptance of the Lookout Mountain Alliance to the BABCNC. The call vote passed unanimously by voice vote. The vote on motion regarding acceptance of the Lookout Mountain Alliance into the BABCNC: Yes: 15, No: 4, abstentions: 4. Motion passed.

- Ron Galperin passed around a photo of the new Home Page of the BABCNC website.
