Administration (Agenda Item #1)

• President Steve Twining called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m. There was a quorum.

Minutes from Previous Meeting (Agenda Item #2)

• Irene Sandler moved to approve the minutes from the last meeting, as corrected. Alan Fine seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Public Comments (Agenda item #3)

- Raymond Yu announced the Year of the Rat, Chinese New Year 2/8/08.
- Cyrus Nownejad spoke regarding his concerns regarding Mansionization and requested an update regarding the issue.
- Steve Kaplan: Re: Anti-Mansionization proposal, requested BABCNC's opposition.
- Patricia Bell-Hearst commented favorably on Anti-Mansionization; warned of possible Proposition 13 reversal at State Level.

Guest Speakers (Item #4)

Candy and Candy –Attorney Harvey Englander and partner gave an informational
presentation for the development at 9900 Wilshire Blvd., Beverly Hills. He discussed traffic
studies showing fewer car trips for residential units than for medical or retail establishments.

Guest Speaker (Item #5)

 Erick Lopez – Associate Planner for City of LA Planning Dept., introduced by Ann Beisch, Discussed/answered questions re: the Baseline Ordinance and Mansionization Ordinance – L.A. will be one of the last cities to maintain neighborhood character, to be defined by each neighborhood.

President's Report (Agenda Item #6)

- No change in the status on the DWP rate increase.
- Introduced David Espinoza as the new Administrator for the BABCNC as of February 2008.
- Steven Cheung from the Mayor's Office briefed N.C. on Proposition S.
 - **Motion** to oppose the telephone transfer tax, known as Proposition S, which is on the February 5, 2008 city wide election. Steve Twining made motion. Motion was seconded. Discussion was held. Vote: 9 yes, 10 no. **Motion failed.**
- The 1/10 Transportation Summit provided information about possible parking meter rate increase.
- Ron Galperin discussed the Financial Disclosure Rule that would list all the BABCNC Members information, similar to Commissioners and Elected Officials. Disclosures are part of the N.C. process of qualifying for putting motions before City Council.

Treasurer's Report (Agenda Item #7)

- Motion <u>Alan</u> Fine moved to approve the Treasurer's Report. Robert Ringler seconded.
 Discussion was held. Motion passed unanimously by voice vote.
- \$2,000 balance due for web site
- Reported on the purchase of tables for Bellagio School.
- Discussed looking into the possibility of purchasing gates and having traffic studies done.

BABCNC Officers Election (Agenda Item #8)

 Board members voted by paper secret ballot for the election of BABCNC officers/ Executive Committee. The following officers were elected:

Bylaws/ Rules Committee Report (Agenda Item #9)

- Larry Leisten moved to approve the motion that the Bylaws of the BABCNC be amended as follows:
 - Motion to amend Article 6 of Bylaws to create position of Immediate Past President, an "ex-officio" position, to have an advisory seat on the Executive Committee, term to continue until next Past President volunteers to be the "ex officio" representative. Discussion was held. Vote: 16 yes, 4 no. Motion passed.
 - Motion to amend Article 6 of Bylaws to create position of President Emeritus, an honorary position with lifetime advisory position on Executive Committee. Discussion was held. Vote: 16 yes, 3 no, I abstain. Motion passed.
- Discussed elections procedures for election of at-large candidate. Discussed options to:
 - (i) have City Clerk administer BABCNC election in June of 2008;
 - (ii) have DONE administer election with assistance of Independent Election Administrator (IEA) at a date other than election date administered by City Clerk; or;
 - (iii) postpone election of at-large candidates until 2010.
 - Motion to have City Clerk administer BABCNC election in June of 2008. Motion was seconded. Discussion was held. Vote: 13 yes, 2 no. Motion passed.

Motion to nominate Steve Twining as BABCNC's first President Emeritus (Agenda Item #10)

Motion to nominate Steve Twining as President Emeritus to the BABCNC. Robert Ringler made motion. Motion was seconded. Discussion was held. Vote: 15 yes, 5 no, 1 abstain. Motion passed.

Mayor's Office Report (Agenda item #11)

- Stephen Cheung announced postponement of Mayor's Day of Service until March 15, 2008.
- The Regional Budget Day is scheduled for February 23, 2008.
- Cheung asked the council to fill out the Budget Survey on the Mayor's Website.

- Kwon update on 9900 Wilshire.

- Motion made in committee to oppose amendments to the Baseline Mansionization Ordinance proposed by Councilman Weiss.
- No position at this time re: Billboard Blight/Special Sign Districts Committee will investigate further
- Motion made and seconded to request status of Quimby funds in Council District #5 from Councilman Jack Weiss; Parks and Recreation Department and City Controlller's office.
 - Motion BABCNC requests the status of Quimby funds for parks in Council District 5 from Councilman Weiss and Parks and Recreation Department. Discussion was held. Vote: 20 yes, 1 no. Motion passed.
