Roll Call (Agenda Item #1)

- President Ringler called the meeting to order at 7:11 pm.
- Secretary Sandler called roll. A quorum was present.

Approval of Minutes from Previous Meeting (Agenda Item #2)

- ♦ Motion to approve the minutes from July 27, 2011. Larry Leisten made motion. Andre Stojka seconded. Discussion was held. Motion passed unanimously.
- ♦ Motion to approve minutes as amended. Motion seconded. Motion passed.

Public Comments (Agenda Item #3)

- Irene Sandler stated that Ron Husdon will not be able to attend the next few meetings.
- Cassandra Barrere reported the BABCNC that Jim Nelson has moved out of the area & will no longer be the
 voting representative of The Laurel Canyon Assoc. (And that he is the new voting representative of S.O.S.)
- Cassandra Barrere also informed the BABCNC that Toni Tucci will be the new voting representative for the Laurel Canyon Association.
- The Council welcomed Toni Tucci.
- Shirley Cohen deferred to Item #10

Streamlining the Legislative Process – Marcia Selz (Agenda Item #4)

- Marcia Selz explained to the Council she would like to urge the City Attorney and Chief Legislative Analyst to
 examine how the city is governed to decide if there is a better approach to City governance. I.e. Aldermanic
 system, boroughs Etc. She stated there are systemic problems and stagnation issues they need to address.
- Ramin Kolahi suggested Neighborhood Councils should be able to take more official positions with regard to City decisions.
- Ron Galperin suggested academic evaluation and charter reform commission on issue is needed prior to vote on suggested motion.
 - ♦ Motion to request City Attorney's office to explore possible structural changes to help bring more local control for local issues. Discussion was held. Motion amended. 11 yeas, 5 nays, 1 abstain. Motion passed.

President's Report (Agenda Item #5)

- Hotel Angeleno Robert A. Ringler updated the BABCNC that a consensus has been reached between the owners of Hotel Angeleno and the community regarding the new lighting system.
 - ♦ Motion to resend letter supporting the BCC. Discussion was held. Motion passed unanimously.
- Ron reported on the redistricting of the 42nd Assembly District, which is now a part of a new valley district. Parts of Santa Monica and the Westside have been added to the 42nd District. County redistricting will be decided by several elected officials including the Sherriff, LA County Assessor.

Treasurer's Report (Agenda Item #6)

- Alan Fine passed out the Treasurer's report.
 - ♦ Motion to approve the Treasurer's report. Alan Fine made motion. Irene Sandler seconded. Discussion was held. Motion passed unanimously by voice vote.
 - ♦ Motion to donate \$250 to the Congress of Neighborhood Councils. Discussion was held. Motion passed unanimously.

LA Budget Report - Steve Twining, Ron Galperin (Agenda Item #7)

- Ron Galperin reported on the City's "Revenue Day" and a presentation by the City Administration Office. Estimates show that within a year the city budget deficit could grow to \$500 million and could continue another 2-3yrs. Short term fixes are fewer and fewer. Most remedies will require voter approval. Parking Occupancy Tax would be a large source of income for the City, \$85 million/yr. Correction of theft from city parking could generate an additional \$20 million/yr. A report on the procurement of \$60 million in vehicle purchases by 3 departments over a six month period, found none of the purchases were in the city of Los Angeles and that the city of LA paid \$6 million in sales tax for these purchases. Ambulance fees have increased and there is a proposal to institute a "no transport" fee.
- Steve Twining announced a Ratepayer's meeting August 25th.

Outreach Committee (Agenda Item #8)

- Robin Greenburg announced the Neighborhood Council emergency kits have arrived and suggested they be distributed to stakeholder boards. She reminded everyone to take home a Board Meeting sign.
- Poll Banners are waiting to be hung, pending city approval of locations.

Land Use Committee (Agenda Item #9)

- Steve Twining briefed the Council on a meeting of the Planning and Land Use Committee. The PLUC requested the Planning Dept. review the project proposed at 1400 Linda Flora with consideration to sequel provisions due to major alterations of land including the removal of prominent ridgeline and the resulting environmental effects. The project is out of compliance with the community plan and raises strong concerns regarding grading of over 76,000 cubic yards, fire protections in a known landslide area and there are concerns for the over 35 homes below the project. The committee is requesting public hearings on this development.
 - Motion to support the position of PLUC. Steve Twining made motion. Motion was seconded. Discussion was held. Motion passed unanimously.

Upper Stone Canyon Reservoir Report (Agenda Item #10)

- Larry Leisten updated the Council on LADWP draft EIR released in June. Current plans are to create underground
 reservoir and cover it with a concrete cover to provide for parkland space. The draft EIR indicated there are other
 cover solutions that would require less soil and would be less costly to the ratepayers, one being a floating plastic
 cover, the other aluminum. Hearing was held during comment period.
- Steve Twining mentioned there were additional considerations to the project such as the posed fire hazard, support of the Roscomare Valley Association's Support the aesthetic and.
- Shirley Cohen with CPOR (Coalition to Protect Open Reservoirs.) She urged the council not to change their original position.
 - ♦ **Motion** to support the floating cover solution and withdraw its (BABCNC) prior support of the now defunct buried tank solution. Motion was seconded. Discussion was held. 10 Nays 7 Abstention. **Motion did not pass.**

42nd Assembly District Report (Agenda Item #11)

No report was given.

Senator Fran Pavley's Office Report (Agenda Item #12)

- Kara distributed Senator Pavley's newsletter and introduced herself as the new representative from the Senator's office. She briefed on the Westside subway which is in the planning phase, as well as LA County redistricting. The Citizen's Redistricting Commission met on August 15th and approved the final Senate Congressional and Assembly maps. The process is currently still in the courts as several organizations are disputing the line drawing process under the voting rights act and some are looking into a referendum process.
- The Council thanked her for her attendance and information.

Council District 5 Report (Agenda Item #13)

- Jeff updated the council public/private partnership with the zoo and animal shelters. He informed the Council of an emergency preparedness event in the Century City mall and Galleria Mall on Sept. 11th, 2011 10am-2pm.
- Irene Sandler expressed concern about the I-405 & Sepulveda construction and suggested placing officers in those areas to guide traffic.

Mayor's Office Report (Agenda Item #14)

• Joseph Hari informed the council of a town hall meeting (WRAC) with the Mayor on <u>September 12th, 2011</u> in the West LA Municipal Bldg. Details will be emailed. Mr. Hari also requested a meeting with the President, Treasurer & outreach coordinator to advise Mayors office on area issues.
