## Roll Call (Agenda Item #1)

President Ringler called the meeting to order at 7:12 pm.

Heather Rozman called roll. A quorum was present.

## Approval of Minutes from Previous Meeting (Agenda Item #2)

♦ **Motion** to approve the minutes from May 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2012. Alan Fine made motion. Robin Greenburg seconded. Discussion was held. **Motion passed by voice vote.** 

#### Public Comments (Agenda Item #3)

- Public Speaker, Raymond Yu announced the Pacific Palisades Americanism Parade on Wednesday, July 4<sup>th</sup> at 2:00pm on Sunset Blvd. For more information visit: <a href="http://www.palisadesparade.org/">http://www.palisadesparade.org/</a>
- Patricia Bell Hearst asked what the webmaster does for the BABCNC. Executive Director, Heather Rozman stated the webmaster designs, uploads content to site and does everything expeditiously.

#### President's Report (Agenda Item #4)

- Mulholland Scenic Corridor Signage Joann Deutch asked the BABCNC for assistance in removing 59 "No Parking" signs from Mulholland Dr. between Laurel Canyon and Coldwater Canyon. Mulholland Design Review Board has not vet been contacted on the issue.
  - ♦ Motion for additional documentation and to invite appropriate agencies responsible for enforcement to the next meeting. If agencies are not available a written response will be requested. Gary Plotkin Made Motion. Gary Gole seconded. Discussion was held. 18 Yeas; 1 Abstention; 1 Nay; Motion Passed.
- Community Care Facility Ordinance (CCFO) Catherine Fikenstaedt and Debbie Semsky briefed the Council of their
  personal experiences with a community care facility in their neighborhood and detailed impacts to surrounding
  communities. They presented a petition signed by area residents in opposition of a proposed facility in their
  neighborhood. They urged the Council to support the upcoming ordinance or assist in re-authoring of the ordinance to
  protect single-family residences.
  - ♦ Motion to consider by next meeting whether to support or decline the current proposed ordinance. Chris Carradine made motion. Gary Plotkin seconded. Discussion was held. 19 Yeas; 1 Abstention; 0 Nays; Motion Passed.
- Council Meeting Proper Conduct & Protocol President Ringler reminded Council members to treat speakers, guests
  of Council meetings, other Council members and employees with respect. He asked that Council members recuse
  themselves from issues where there may be a conflict of interest of if they have a personal stake in a matter. Gary
  Plotkin is working in committee to organize a retreat for the BABCNC Board to resolve outstanding issues.

#### Treasurer's Report (Agenda Item #5)

Alan Fine distributed the Treasurer's report, and the 2012-2013 budget. He stated there are remaining funds from
the 2011-2012 budget in the amount of \$13,000.00. A request for \$3,000 has been filed with DONE for the
mailing of BABCNC Brochures. The Verizon phone bill has not been paid by DONE. Funds have been held from
the 2011-2011 fiscal year to cover this. Alan provided details of the new budget including a raise in the Executive
Director's pay. Gary Plotkin stated more money may need to be available for the Board Retreat. Don Loze asked

if the budget can be amended at a later date. Alan stated yes, however the presented budget must be submitted to DONE within the month. Ron Galperin commented that he objects to the budget as the BABCNC is allocating outreach money to pay for administrative support. Ron also stated that he believes DONE had specific requirements for funding that must be spent on outreach.

- Motion to approve Treasures Report. Alan Fine made motion. Gary Plotkin seconded. Discussion was held. 20
   Yeas; 1 Nay; 0 Abstentions. Motion passed.
- ♦ Motion to approve 2012-2013 budget as proposed. Motion was made. Motion seconded. Discussion was held. 14 Yeas; 4 Nays; 1 Abstention. Motion passed.

#### Land Use Committee (Agenda Item #6)

- 9655 W. Lawlen Way Representative, Chris Parker updated the PLU committee on project plans.
- 1531 Gilcrest Dr. Carol Sidlow informed the PLU committee the property owners have received a B permit which does not require a public hearing.
  - ♦ "Motion to consider approaching City Council with clarifications to the B permit procedure vis-à-vis the baseline ordinance." Chris Carradine made motion. Gary Plotkin seconded. Discussion was held. **Motion passed unanimously.**
- 1400 Linda Flora Steve Twining updated the PLU committee his Attorney, John Murdock has successfully postponed
  the hearing previously scheduled for June 12, 2012. New hearing date scheduled August 14, 2012. Discussion was
  held re: haul routes associated with proposed development.
  - ♦ "Motion to send letter to Building &Safety, Department of City Planning, DC-5, State Agencies, etc. stating the hearing date scheduled for August 14<sup>th</sup> is inappropriate until the requirements of the letters from the Water Quality Control Board letter along with the requirements of the fish and Game letter have been met; therefore the 2007 MND is inadequate." Steve Twining made motion. Chris Carradine seconded. **Motion passed unanimously.**

#### Outreach Committee Report (Agenda Item #7)

- Robin Greenberg reported on a Westside Regional Alliance of Councils (WRAC) meeting and presented a motion regarding DONE and City notification of issues to Neighborhood Councils.
  - ♦ Motion to approve the document labeled "Attachment A" as presented by WRAC. Steve Twining made motion. Robin Greenberg seconded. 16 Yeas; 0 Nays; 3 Abstentions. Motion passed.

#### Council District 5 Report (Agenda Item #12)

- Jeffry Ebenstein reported the CD-5 Deputy will attend the July meeting to discuss fracking which may affect the
  hillside communities as there are correlations between fracking and earthquakes. He also noted Councilman
  Koretz would like to put in a motion to fully fund the Fire Departments and reconcile the emergency response
  times. Starting in July LADOT services with be reinstated.
- Councilman Koretz attended the meeting to discuss issues with the BABCNC. Steve Twining asked what the
  Councilman's perspective on the CCFO. Councilman Koretz stated they are often times problematic and he
  supports the CCFO's efforts to regulate. He also discussed redistricting and the sentiment of communities. Don
  Loze commented he would like to have CD-4 and CD-5 come together to support the Ridgeline Ordinance.
  Councilman Koretz said he would be amenable to a meeting. The Council thanked Councilman Koretz for his
  attendance.
