 Per Len Schaffer, at its January 28, 2017 meeting, the NCEPA passed a motion supporting the multi-departmental budget request by DONE and the Emergency Management Department to help prepare our communities for the next big earthquake or disaster. (Attachment B.)

 Motion: That the BABCNC supports the inclusion of \$192,000 as a multi-departmental budget item in the 2017-18 city budget to cover the cost of four (4) staff and related expenses. Two staff members for DONE aka EmpowerLA, and two for the Emergency Management Department, who will work on preparing a disaster preparedness plan, which will lead to pre-placement of supplies for first responders and training of individuals at the neighborhood level.

Owner: Guy Phillips 310-871-5241 Agent/Rep: Brian Noteware, AIA Inc 310-452-6500 andrew@briannoteware.com Staff: Nuri Cho 213-978-1177 nuri.cho@lacity.org At the 12/21/16 BABCNC Board meeting, motion was approved, based on the 12/13/16 PLU Committee recommendation, to support this request, with the stipulation that the presenter provide a staging plan showing that the property can accommodate 8 spaces, or more, as needed; and, to allow a 5' front yard setback in lieu of the prevailing setback of 15'- 11"; and, to allow an additional 20% in height increase from required 24' max height for the 1st 20 feet from frontline property line measured from the center of the street for lots located on substandard street. Mr. Noteware emailed a staging plan on 01/09/2017, and has been invited to share that with the Board, for final approval. (Attachment F)

Motion To support, based upon the applicant's provision of the staging plan as requested.

c. <u>11007 W Bellagio Place</u>, <u>90077</u>: Bureau of Street Services BPW-2017-0091 for ENV-2016-1784-MND Case No.: ZA-2014-4714(ZAD) ENV-2014-4715-CE. This is in regards to the MND and associated permit application to remove 34 trees protected under the City's Protected Tree Ordinance No. 177404 for the above residential development site.

At the 02/16/2017 PLU meeting, the committee unanimously approved a motion to oppose adoption of this project's MND and its tree removal permit due to the unmitigated environmental impacts associated with the tree removal, and to prepare a letter to the Dept. of Public Works Commissioner, Kevin James, President, DPW Commission.

<u>Motion</u>: To submit a letter urging the Commission to recognize the cumulative impacts being suffered in the hillside areas due to development, and ask it to forestall further losses to our remaining protected trees and wildlife habitat by rejecting the MND and its proposed mitigations as inadequate, and by voting against approval of the tree removal permit. - **a.** <u>Motion</u>: BABCNC supports the Westside Regional Alliance of Councils' request that LA City Planning compute the maximum build out under existing zoning for low, medium and high density residential zones as well as commercial zones. These calculations shall include the highest possible SB1818 and JJJ density bonuses, as well as Accessory Dwelling Units ("granny flats") for each of the neighborhood and community councils in the Westside Regional Alliance of Councils.
- **b.** <u>Motion</u>: BABCNC supports the Westside Regional Alliance of Councils' request for updated current figures on population and population density in the WRAC area, to include a comparison to 2010 figures.

17. LANCC: Los Angeles Neighborhood Council Coalition – André Stojka

At their 02/04/2017 meeting, the following two (2) motions were approved:

- **a.** <u>Motion</u>: The BABCNC is concerned that since 2006, the City Council has authorized \$614,443,554 in lawsuit payouts. Out of the \$614,443,554 in payouts, \$503,565,107 was authorized for lawsuits against LAPD. This amount was not for excessive force or officer-involved shootings, but for lawsuits by officers against management for sexual harassment, retaliations, sexual orientation discrimination, race/color/national origin discrimination, and general discrimination, to name a few. The BABCNC demands that the City Council and specifically Councilmember Paul Koretz and his Personnel and Animal Welfare Committee create a plan in 45 days to stop the abuse of members of the City Family and the Taxpayer who are subjected to the loss of City services by the payout of these lawsuits.
- b. Motion: Whereas the City plans to change NC election procedures unilaterally and, Whereas the City plans to make all NC elections self-affirmation against the will of some boards and bylaws, and Whereas the City plans to reduce unilaterally the voting age of stakeholders in some NCs to 16 years of age, against the bylaws and will of the boards, and Whereas the City is mandating all NCs to use online voting only, against the will of some boards who voted against online voting, and Whereas the City is attempting to mold neighborhood councils to fit an electronic voting model rather than fitting the contracted for electronic voting model to neighborhood councils. Therefore, the BABCNC moves to demand that the City suspend online voting unless and until it can show evidence that the online model is complete and secure as contracted for, that the City will provide proper outreach, that the Department can show that it has returned to its core mission of supporting NCs and can truly support neighborhood councils per its Charter mandate, and allow all of the councils, per the Charter, Ordinance and Plan, to self rule for the benefit of its stakeholders, and to allow the NCs to determine whether it should be online, self-determination, and age specific for its voters.
