A Conditional Use Permit for continued sale of a full line of alcoholic beverages in conjunction with an existing 60,461 sf hotel having 64 seats indoor and 123 outdoors. Andre Balazs (Chateau Holdings, Ltd.)

[Liz Optholt, Project Coordinator, with the Elizabeth Peterson Group, Inc., representing the Chateau Marmont, and Phil Pavel, Manager of the Chateau, presented their request for renewal of existing CUP, which is expiring, to the BABCNC PLU Committee. They related that there will be no update or changes planned for the new CUP; hours remain 6:00am to 2:00am and 24 hours for the hotel. Liz noted that this site is registered as a Los Angeles Historic Cultural Monument. The original CUP was from 2008 with plan approval in 2011; expired in February of this year. Their ZA hearing is on May 24.]

- 15. <u>WRAC</u>: Westside Regional Alliance of Councils Robin Greenberg & Nickie Miner a. Update by WRAC Representative: WRAC asks that the BABCNC <u>approve</u> the following motion approved at WRAC's Wednesday 05-17-2017 Meeting:

Motion: Transparency in General Plan:

- We request that Planning Department Work Group meetings now underway about our shared ideas and ideals for the Los Angeles General Plan and its many Elements be made fully transparent, be set at evening and weekend hours; be open to the public as of now; include a representative chosen by the Measure S campaign; and expand from the four meetings, now nearly completed in closed-door meetings, to four additional meetings that follow the above prescription.
- We further request, in the same vein, that the Mayor's Planning Task Force and Transportation Infrastructure Steering Committee for the General Plan be made fully transparent, be set at evening and weekend hours; be open to the public as of now; and expand its closed-door meetings to several additional meetings that follow the above prescription.
- In addition, we would like to have summaries of previous meetings, which were closed-door sessions.
- 16. <u>LANCC:</u> Los Angeles Neighborhood Council Coalition André Stojka (continued from last month) a. Update by BABCNC LANCC Representative: LANCC asks that the BABCNC <u>approve</u> the following:
 - i. <u>Motion</u>: The Los Angeles Neighborhood Council (LANCC) and Bel Air Beverly Crest Neighborhood Council opposes Mayor Eric Garcetti's proposal to close part of the City's \$250 million budget gap for next year by using an estimated \$50 million of Local Return money from Measure M, the permanent half cent increase in our sales tax that was approved by 71% of voters in November, 2016. We support that the funds be evenly distributed between the Council Districts to fix, pave, or repair our streets. We also support that the Neighborhood Councils have a more active role in the decisions of how the funds will be spent as they have considerable experience based on the Small Asphalt Repairs (SAR) Program.
 - ii. <u>Motion:</u> The Los Angeles Neighborhood Council (LANCC) and Bel Air Beverly Crest Neighborhood Council supports the actions by LAPD to allow online reporting of certain, low level crimes, but it does not go far enough. According to the US Bureau of Justice statistics, in 2015 an estimated 35 percent of property crimes like burglary and motor-vehicle thefts were not reported to the police nationwide and these crimes are not reportable to LAPD online. LAPD asks residents to be the eyes and ears to help reduce crime, but residents need the tools to make the job easier. We ask City Council to open a Council File to look at expanding the Online Reporting Program for LAPD and other reporting tools to make Los Angeles safer.

<u>Background</u>: AB 1103 is a bill introduced by several legislatures, among them State Assembly Member Richard Bloom, representing the 50th District. The bill proposes to enact into law an "Idaho Stop" for bicyclists, which more or less permits cyclists to enter an intersection where there is a 4-way stop without coming to a full stop, but only when conditions are safe to do so.
