- 1. Call to Order Robin Greenberg, President, called the meeting to order at 7:07pm.
- Roll Call: Robert Ringler, Secretary, called the roll with 18 present, and 21 by 8:00pm. Appointments included: John Amato for the Private Schools K-6 seat and Jon Wimbish for the Private Schools 7-12 seat; as well as Heather Roy & Valerie O'Brien as Alternates for Laurel Canyon Association (LCA). Heather Roy sat in for Jamie Hall this evening.
- 3. Pledge of Allegiance
- 4. Approval of <u>September 27, 2017 Agenda</u> (per Bylaws, Article VIII, Section 2) <u>Moved</u> by Robert; <u>seconded</u> by Robert S. <u>17 Yes; 0 No; 0 Abstentions; Approved.</u>
- Approval of <u>July 26, 2017 Minutes</u> (Attachment A) Copy was circulated with agenda. <u>Moved</u> by Cathy W. <u>seconded</u> by Mike Kemp. <u>17 Yes; 0 No; 0 Abstentions; Approved.</u>
- 6. Public Comment (on any topic not on adopted agenda, within the Board's jurisdiction): <u>Patrice Noteware</u>: Ms. Noteware expressed concern about blight on Sepulveda, south of Getty Center to Church Lane, at Bel Terrace, and at the Moraga off ramp; noted that weeds & grasses are increasing in height from 3' to 5-10.' Irene Sandler reported having been to a meeting called by CD11, with no one from CD5, and with entities including Cal-Trans, with goal of cleanup & beautification along Sepulveda. She asked that they at least address Moraga. She asked if Bel Air Association could write a letter.

Steve Twining: Steve gave update from WRAC's land use committee that meets at WLA City Hall and asked that our PLUC consider some recommended motions including that Planning Commissioners have 5-year terms; that Council members shall invite NC reps to all meetings with developers, and noted the need to list all campaign contributions from developers, employees and spouses. **Steve** also commented on need to further discuss homelessness, noting suggestion by Sheila Kuehl that the unused courthouse in WLA be converted for the homeless.

Patricia Bell Hearst: Ms. Bell Hearst spoke on the proposed Berggruen Institute project on the west side of the 405, which will include numerous facilities, parking and heli-pads; will involve events, security issues, traffic, air quality, methane, ridgeline destruction, among others. Community leaders have met at the Skirball in May and August, and MRCA has met about this. She noted that Wendy-Sue Rosen will speak on this at BABCNC and that "City Hall knows that we are not happy." Patricia reported that the project will involve zone change from residential to educational. **Patricia** also commented on issue about losing CEQA and suggested Robert Silverstein come speak on this. [Nickie arrived at 7:23 pm.]

Walt Young from the Mountains Recreation & Conservation Authority (MRCA) gave update on the results of Measure A. He just returned from Puerto Rico where he was doing disaster-relief. He noted that on July 1, they started 7-night patrols on Mulholland and go 24 hours when red flag; currently anticipate 2-3-day red flag days between now and November; focusing on having cars out, and on red flag days, engines out on Mulholland. Asked who gives them authority, Walt noted they are California Peace Officers; authority extends for any park-type offense on their owned or managed property for park-related offenses or offenses that rise to level of serious property crime or threat to the public, under #836 of the Penal Code. They deal with quality of life issues; occasionally warrants. They link to the LAPD through radio; LAPD still retains municipal police function responsibility; they have a good relationship with them. Nikki Ezhari, Field Deputy for CD-4 Council Member, David Ryu: Nikki related that the draft party-house ordinance is out; the Councilmembers' discretionary fund data is now online; LAPD & Department have updated certain speed zones; some up and some down to allow the LAPD to monitor with a speed gun. Robert Ringler related that the use of radar gives the officer a tool; we have a safe speed law in California; "it is a quality of life issue; you need the enforcement. The question is whether they have the resources."

Jasmine Elbarbary, DONE Project Director: Jasmine related that Semee is out this week. City Council has yet to decide on NC elections; if we want selections next year, we'll need to fill out proper form. They're still collecting demographic data from NCs; it is optional; she'll have to guess if not provided.

Sidewalk Repair Program Environmental Impact Report Initial Study (Discussion & Action) Background: Dr. Whitford reported that the City's Bureau of Engineering has begun the environmental review process for this Sidewalk Repair Program, and was accepting initial public comments on the scope of the EIR, which will shape the scope and content of the draft EIR by September 15. She reported that the City has claimed an <u>exemption</u> from the normal CEQA process requiring an EIR be completed prior to commencement of a project; and that instead, they will be conducting the EIR process while the Program is underway. Removal of healthy, mature street trees throughout Los Angeles is a part of this process; and, to date, about 200 such trees have been removed. There is no Council File number (for a CIS at this time). 15. Hillside Federation Requested Updated CIS for Signs Ordinance

Motion: The BABCNC supports the new sign ordinance version B+ as approved by the City Planning Commission on 10/22/2015 and urges the PLUM Committee and City Council to adopt that version of the ordinance that: a) Disapproves any AMNESTY for existing billboards that lack permits or have been altered in violation of their permits.

b) Disapproves "grandfathering" of any sign districts that weren't approved or applied for in April 2009, when the CPC approved the initial version of the new sign ordinance.

c) Restricts any new off-site signs, including digital billboards, to sign districts in 22 areas zoned for highintensity commercial use.

d) Requires existing billboards to be taken down before any new off-site signs can go up in sign districts. The takedown ratio of existing signs to new signs should be 5 removals to 1 new static sign for conventional and 10 takedowns to 1 for digital. Proximity of takedowns to new signs to be negotiated.

e) Sets administrative civil penalties for sign violators that will act as a real deterrent to illegal billboards and other signage. f) Prohibits off-site signage in city parks and recreation facilities.

Motion: With regard to Council file CPC-2017-455-CA, WRAC & BABCNC believe no temporary offsite advertising signs should be allowed on construction fencing and that other regulations should be imposed including limiting paint color; openings provided every 50 linear ft. for police to peer in and deter crime; limiting signage to fences that face/front C zones; signs be allowed only on active construction sites (not on vacant sites that are being leased for car storage or construction staging for another site); maximum amount of signage limited to 6 sf of signage for every 50 ft.; and stringent graffiti cleanup. WRAC believes there is no public benefit to allow such signs all over the city when billboards are limited.

ii. Permit Streamlining Act compliance with deadlines: Deferred

Motion: The City shall take proactive, definitive measures to comply with State laws that establish time limits for entitlement approvals, including the Permit Streamlining Act, and shall advise Neighborhood and Community Councils of these time limits as they draw near. These measures shall include but not limited to: 1. Creation of a new tracking/tagging system with deadline alerts.

- 2. Align the date of the CEQA determination (whenever possible, with the entitlement determination).
- 3. Asking applicants to voluntarily extend any determinative timelines at time of application submittal.

iii. Increased transparency into the relationship between LA DWP and the IBEW Deferred

<u>Motion</u>: *Whereas* the DWP Board of Water and Power Commissions approved the new labor agreement between the Department of Water and Power and IBEW Local 18 at a Special Meeting on Tuesday, June 20, 2017; *Whereas* the Notice of this Special Meeting was not given until Monday, June 19, 2017;

Whereas the documentation concerning the new labor agreement was not placed on line until the day of the meeting; *Whereas* the City Council approved the new labor agreement on June 28, 2017;

Whereas DWP, the City Council, and the Mayor did not conduct any outreach to the Neighborhood Councils or the Ratepayers;

Whereas the lack of transparency erodes the trust of confidence of Ratepayers and Angelenos in the Department, the City Council, and the Mayor;

Therefore, the BABCNC joins with the Neighborhood Council DWP Advocacy Committee in condemning the lack of transparency by DWP, the City Council, and the Mayor;

Therefore, the BABCNC calls for a full presentation and discussion on the new labor agreement to the Neighborhood Councils and Ratepayers.
