1. Call to Order: President, Robin Greenberg, called the meeting to order at 7:03 pm.

- 2. Roll Call: 21 present initially. Heather Roy stood in for Cathy Wayne who was out sick. Jamie arrived 7:19, for a total of 22; Jacqueline at 7:53, for a total of 23. New member, Sam Sanandaji, DPM, replacing Gary Plotkin, was ratified in his absence, at the start of the meeting, and arrived at the table at 8:14 pm, at which time we had 24 present & 8 absent. Sam had completed the ethics, funding and code-of-conduct trainings.
- 3. Pledge of Allegiance
- 4. Approval of <u>January 24, 2018 Agenda:</u> <u>Moved by</u> Larry, <u>seconded by</u> Andre. Larry noted that we do not need a motion to approve a committee meeting. (The agenda had possible motion to schedule meetings for committees that had not met recently.) <u>21/0/0; passed as corrected</u>.
- 5. Approval of <u>December 20, 2017 Minutes</u> (Attachment A) Copy was circulated with agenda. <u>Moved by</u> Nickie, <u>seconded by</u> Andre; <u>21/0/0; passed as written</u>.
- 6. Public Comment: Pamela Pierson would like to know from Linda and Jamie (who were not present) the legal results of the trees action. As to protected animal pathways along Mulholland, she would like Tony to know that they can appeal to the Dept. of the Interior. To the Traffic Committee, she noted that Sherman Oaks is getting coverage, and asked if we can do what other municipalities are doing that have passed laws precluding people from transiting through communities within peak traffic hours, that are giving traffic violations and requiring permits. She would like to know City Council's position on tour buses, the municipal code that regulates them, and if enforced as to licenses, times and extent of touring. Pamela concluded that Sherman Oaks forced WAZE out of community.

Joanne Deutsch gave a tribute to Jackie Hunsicker, who has sadly passed away. She described Jackie as a "fearless volunteer," and related examples of her great service to the community. She noted that Jackie and Jason Post supported a "no litter zone." Their mission was to have people stop dumping. She related that we will all miss her, and asked that we keep giving to Raul. She noted that Jackie was always happy to help, and asked that we carry on in her memory. "Do not let the work drop because she passed away."

Robert Mahron: Robert related that a committee of Laurel Canyon Association is working on adopting five medians for beautification using the city's "Adopt a Median" Program. He is asking for letter and financial support. They will be between Sunset and Mulholland in Laurel Canyon. They have requested funds from CD4, LCA & Mount Olympus who are all supporting. They are trying to raise \$15,000.00.

- c. Bill Roen, President, Casiano Estates HOA, appointed Sam Sanandaji to represent Casiano Estates HOA: <u>Motion</u> To ratify appointment of Sam Sanandaji to represent Casiano Estates on the BABCNC. <u>Moved</u> by Bob; <u>seconded by</u> Andre; <u>21 yes</u>; <u>0 no</u>; <u>0 abstentions</u>; <u>passed</u>.

d. Representatives of Elected Officials and Agencies (Update & Discussion)

i. **Janet Turner, Field Representative for 33rd District Congressman Ted Lieu:** Janet expressed the Congressman's concern about our fires, and noted that he tweeted to his constituents. On February 10th, Ted Lieu is having his annual academy day. She asked that we get word out to students interested in military academies. There will be admissions directors, parent groups, and a student panel. She mentioned a cyberspace act, as well as a bipartisan music modernization act so musicians can get paid for downloads. She mentioned an award for stopping animal experimentation at the WLAVA.

ii. Faisal Alserri, Senior Planning Deputy for CD-5 CM Paul Koretz – Not present

iii. Alice Roth Field Deputy for CD-4 CM David Ryu: Alice shared the Councilmember's and her own best regards for the new year. She brought a box of City guides with contact info for city council members and city agencies. She gave updates, noting that the homeless count was taking place this evening, for which the city and county are coming together. She noted that CD4 is supporting the median project led by Rob Mahron. Tony Tucci mentioned a project under construction, which has an appeal filed to the Department of Building & Safety (2239 Laurel Canyon Blvd.) He opined that we need reform on how B&S looks at an appeal in a timely way, as this could be built before the appeal is addressed. They do not have a timeframe.

iv. **Semee Park, Director of Neighborhood Council Operations**: Semee reminded us about the upcoming deadline for bylaws amendments, and noted that election workshops start next month. She will send us emails with details. The Westside is scheduled for 21st of February.

a. Update/Report by EP Chair, on the January 17, 2018 EP Committee Meeting – Chuck Maginnis gave update on the successful meeting with a group he described as the "Magnificent Seven." He noted that BCA's meeting was dedicated to EP. Don Loze praised Armando Hogan, Assistant Chief with 34 years with LAFD. Don thanked Chuck for the people who came to the BCA meeting. He encouraged each association on this board to dedicate time to emergency preparedness. "Now's the time to start organizing" in preparation for the predicted earthquake.

Planning & Land Use Committee (Updates, Discussion & Action) – Robert Schlesinger, Chair [Robert, Stephanie Savage, Michael Kemp, Robin Greenberg, Nickie Miner, Don Loze, Jamie Hall, Jason Spradlin, Maureen Levinson, Leslie Weisberg, Steve Twining and Yves Mieszala] a. Update/Report by Chair – <u>At the January 9, 2018 Meeting – The PLU Committee voted to</u> recommend that the BABCNC Board ratify the following motions and/or positions:

b. 8500 W Franklin Ave. ZA-2016-3023-ZAD ENV-2016-3024-CE Lot: 8,692.3 sf R1, SFR, 2nd & 3rd stry add and remodel. Allow 0 frt yd setback in lieu of 5', proposed add to exc 81sf, max allowed 4,258, add 20% increase fr req 24' to a max of 33'(Using 3 Slope Bands) Owner-Appl: Randal Haworth Agent/Rep: Amilcar Hosteraill & Brian Noteware A.I.A. The PLU Committee again heard from Mr. Hosteraill, who was accompanied by Mr. Noteware.

<u>Position</u>: The Committee recommended, by a vote of 10/0/0, that the presenter <u>return</u> with some options to look at the articulation of the surface to detract from the fact that he has a three-story building and a nonconforming front yard. Stephanie gave update on this and that they will come back.

c. 8241 W Grand View Dr. ZA-2017-1398-ZAD ENV-2017-1399-CE (8246 Mannix Drive) Lots 74 & 75 of Tract No. 798, and Lot L of Tract No. 2042. Total Lot Area 9,244.6 SFR, Const of new 2 stry over basement single-family residence. Grading No H/Rte or tree remov. Propty does not have veh access on a cont 20' wide paved route from driveway to boundary of Hillside area. To allow a 33' max building ht with roof slope less than 25% in lieu of 28' in order to eliminate requirement for a roof greater than 25% at house frnt. 2 additional ret walls, total (4). Allow 4 add on-site pkng due to no avail street pkng adj to development, and (b) allow for light-well type design on northeasterly side of structure. Applicant: Scott Spiro CEQA - Advanced Engineering & Consulting Agent/Rep: James Heimler Arch Note: Per Bob Schlesinger, the City has only sent us Grand View and <u>not</u> Mannix. Stephanie noted that Laurel Canyon has a list of concerns. The PLU Committee heard again from Mr. Heimler, Architect. Position: The Committee voted unanimously to <u>deny, pending or subject to</u> any changes he can make and a proper CEQA review. We will provide a list of specifics for him to address. Stephanie related that the committee denied this until they can address the list of 10 concerns. Jamie noted that there are 12 projects off Grand View; other projects have been put on hold; and Council Member Kortez is supporting that there are cumulative impacts that have to be addressed and that this is one of them. <u>Motion</u>: To oppose this proposal until or unless additional information is brought to us. <u>Moved</u> by Travis; <u>seconded</u> by Maureen. <u>22 yes; 0 no; 0 abstentions; passed</u>.

Stephanie related that they came back twice. <u>Motion</u>: To approve <u>moved by</u> Robert. Discussion was held. Hand count taken: <u>8 yes</u>; <u>10 no</u>; <u>3 abstentions</u>; <u>failed</u>.

Update/Report by Chair: The Committee met on Wednesday, 01/10/2018, and discussed plans for a community town hall regarding the Skirball fire with a panel of speakers made up of representatives from the city and local agencies. The committee also discussed Blight Clean Up in partnership with MRCA.

b. <u>Hold a Town Hall at Rosenfeld Aud. / Franklin Canyon, RE: Skirball Fire</u> (Attachment C) <u>i. Motion</u>: Per the unanimous recommendation of the Outreach Committee, the BABCNC shall hold a community town hall with speakers from the city and other agencies with a moderator, André Stojka, to address prepared questions related to the Skirball fire, to include but not limited to impacts of and solutions to homeless encampments in high fire hazard severity zones. (Date/Time: January 31, 2018 from 7-9pm) <u>Moved by</u> Chuck; <u>seconded by</u> Larry; <u>23 yes</u>; <u>0 no</u>; <u>0 abstentions</u>; <u>9 absent</u>; <u>approved</u>.

<u>ii. Further discussion was held on plans for the town hall, wherein Robin read from a list of additional questions provided by Maureen Levinson. Maureen and Stephanie volunteered to streamline the questions.

At 8:14 pm, newly ratified Board member, Sam Sanandaji, who had been in the audience with Casiano Estates HOA President, Bill Roen, was asked to come to the table and introduce himself. He expressed hope to be able to fill Gary's shoes, and was warmly welcomed to the Board. *[24 present.]*

c. <u>Discussion & Possible Motion to have a "Blight Clean-Up" Community Improvement Project (CIP)</u> <u>Possible Motion</u>: To clean up blight in the BABCNC area by driving a truck through the canyons; request a truck from MRCA and tools from the city, as a combined-agency activity with MRCA, in January or February; budget to be worked out, to be paid by our Clean Streets award funds (up to \$750.00). Robin noted that we have access to trucks to drive around clean-up blight. Leslie suggested asking Jon Wimbish from Westlake if he can make this a school project and offer the kids credit for participating.

17. <u>Westside Regional Alliance of Councils</u> (WRAC) Robin Greenberg & Nickie Miner a. Update by BABCNC WRAC Representative: January 17th meeting

b. Motion: Opposition to Transit-Rich Housing Bonus Bill [Weiner, SB 827]

i. Whereas the City Charter-mandated Neighborhood Council system of Los Angeles, and the Community Councils of the City of Los Angeles, represent grass roots democracy,
ii. Whereas the newly introduced California State Senate Bill 827 [Scott Weiner] as written constitutes a top down pen stroke planning measure which completely removes land use and planning authority within one half mile of high quality transit from jurisdictions and charter cities,
iii. Whereas removal of said authority clearly abolishes local input into land use planning and therefore constitutes an attack upon local democracy, upon neighborhoods, and upon the Neighborhood Councils and Community Councils in the City of Los Angeles,

iv. Whereas SB 827 as written trashes the density bonus and wage provisions of the JJJ TOC ordinance which were recently enacted by the people of Los Angeles—in good faith—in order to *guarantee* transit close housing opportunities would actually be available to working and low income persons and families in the City of Los Angeles,

v. Whereas the lack of analysis of infrastructure and other costs associated with this pen stroke planning creates grave uncertainty that a local agency would be able to *"levy enough service charges, fees or assessments sufficient to pay for the program or level of service mandated by this act within the meaning of Section 17556 of the Government Code"*,

vi. Whereas, given the aforementioned lack of fiscal analysis, Section 6 of Article XIII B of the California Constitution "No reimbursement" clause is cited inappropriately in this legislation,

vii. Therefore, the Bel Air Beverly Crest Neighborhood Council opposes SB 827 in its present form. <u>Moved by</u> Robert; <u>seconded by</u> Andre. Travis gave update on this item, noting that the bill would supersede local zoning regulations around "transit" which would mean an inability to have design review, a say on number of floors, units per parcel, among other things, and all of this will be done from Sacramento. Travis showed us a map put together by a fellow who supports the bill; the map has two colors, one around corridors and one around junctions, and illustrated that this involves all of Los Angeles minus the hillsides. He noted that even advocates recognize that this is an aggressive proposal that does away with local zoning. Nickie added that this means no local control, that the state will control us, and that this backs up the idea to get rid of RU1-zoned housing, so-called "under-utilized space" (per the city's language). It would affect a half-mile radius around any transit district. She would not want the bill in any form.

<u>24 yes; 0 no; 0 abstentions, passed</u>. To send to WRAC, the Assembly members, Mayor, Governor. 18. Discussion, Possible Motion with Submission of a CIS on <u>Eliminating Categorical Exemptions</u> on Filing of Planning Cases: <u>Possible Motion</u>: To pass a resolution to let the City and the CD4 and CD5 offices know that the BABCNC believes that categorical exemptions (CEs) should not be given to residential development in our area for two reasons: 1) preservation of the hills and open space, as detailed in the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy Act passed by the legislature in 1979 and 2) the cumulative impact of the large number of construction sites currently in our area.

Jamie related that he came across the SMMC Act, and read from it, noting that the Santa Monica Mountains are "an environmental resource of critical concern." He noted that he read this to PLUM Committee and they said "they don't care."

<u>Motion</u>: To support this as a letter to the Mayor and other city representatives <u>moved by</u> Tony; <u>seconded by</u> Larry. Discussion was held; and the motion <u>passed</u> by <u>24 yes</u>; <u>0 no</u>; <u>0 abstentions</u>; and <u>8 absent</u>. (Sam voted.) (Jamie will provide letter.)
