 - ii. Alice Roth, Field Deputy for CD-4 CM David Ryu Alice will no longer be Deputy for our area; she will be at Hollywood & Cahuenga. She introduced her replacement, Field Deputy, Daniel Eyal: Daniel.eyal@lacity.org & noted that Emma Howard is the New Planning Deputy. Updates: Party House Ordinance went through April 15; "Love Street Festival" July 15 @ "Rockwell Trail." Laurel Canyon Disaster Prep meeting May 17. They are taking speed hump applications.

Daniel Eyal introduced himself. He has been working with the Bird Streets community on construction issues. The board welcomed him & expressed appreciation for Alice.

- iii. Semee Park, Director of Neighborhood Council Operations noted that our Bylaws are in, and commended Larry and the Board for getting it done.
- iv. Chris Ragsdale, Senior Lead Officer, West Los Angeles Police Station: Not present
- v. Ralph Sanchez, Senior Lead Officer, Hollywood Division: Not present
- vi. Officer Ernie Schoop & Officer Ryan Basaker, West Traffic, Local Traffic Issues Ernie Schoop introduced himself & Ryan Basaker, noting that West Traffic covers Venice to 110 Freeway, Venice, Hwd., WLA and Olympic areas. Their main function is addressing traffic-related issues. Maureen Smith asked what she should have done when she found a company holding up traffic while putting up cell towers without permit. Alice recommended calling 311. Jeremy Summers complimented the work that the officers have done in Franklin Canyon, with people cutting through the park, 73% of whom were found to be residents. Ellen Evans asked what to do at intersections to achieve greater compliance. Ryan noted that the majority of complaints are stop signs or speed and that additional signs do <u>not</u> help. Dan Palmer asked about North Beverly Glen & Sunset/St. Pierre, with no left hand turn/no U, as well as left turn onto BG from Sunset. Chuck asked who to call if gridlock. Robert noted "rest on red" does not work. They invite us to call their unit and they will send officers to investigate, do visual monitoring, issue citations; they also initiate signage changes.

a. Senate Bill 831 Related to Land Use: Accessory Dwelling Units (last amended 04-09-2018) Resolution: To oppose SB 831: The BABCNC of the Westside Regional Alliance of Councils opposes SB813, which would eliminate the FAR, floor area square footage, of Accessory Dwelling Units from a site's total floor area. No compelling reason, and no planning justification, has been presented that demonstrates how the physical conditioned, livable space of an ADU is different from the physical conditioned, livable space of the property.

b. Senate Bill 946 Related to Sidewalk Vendors (last amended 04-11-2018)

Resolution: To oppose SB 946: The BABCNC of the Westside Regional Alliance of Councils opposes SB946, in which the State of California would establish sidewalk vending regulations for local municipalities. The bill would require local regulations to permit vending in parks and public spaces and would now allow location restrictions unless "directly related to objective health, safety or welfare concerns." The City of Los Angeles is currently analyzing sidewalk-vending options.
