CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW 30 FEET HIGH 3-STORY ONE-FAMILY DWELLING AND ATTACHED ONE-CAR GARAGE.

Requested Entitlement:

A NEW 3-STORY, 30 FEET HIGH ONE-FAMILY RESIDENCE IN THE RE15-1-HCR ZONE, WITH REQUESTS FOR:

- A ZONE VARIANCE PURSUANT TO LAMC SECTION 12.27 TO ALLOW CONSTRUCTION OF A ONE-CAR GARAGE IN LIEU OF THE REQUIRED TWO COVERED PARKING SPACES FOR A ONE-FAMILY RESIDENCE AND

- 33. Discussion & Possible Motion to Approve Standing Rule Re Individual Member Activity Don Loze
 - Motion: Whenever the Board or any of its Committees, Standing or Ad Hoc, takes a formal position on an issue by way of motion and majority vote, and subsequent to such action, a Member of the Board or Committee expresses a view on such issue to a third party, such as at a public meeting, before a private group (i.e., homeowner association), or to the media, that is contrary to the position taken by the Board or Committee, such Member shall notify the Board or Committee in writing within three (3) calendar days of such communication. If time is of the essence (i.e., subsequent action by public or private body or publication of news story) for a representative of the Board or Committee to inform such third party of its position on the matter, then such notice shall be immediate. Such Member may only express such contrary view when specifically qualifying such view as individual or personal, and not as a Member of the Board or Committee.
- 34. Re-Vote on CLAW NPG, With A New BAC (Vote Count Sheet) in the 2020-2021 FY. This NPG was approved at the 05/22/2020 meeting; however, per Funding, application had a 07/01/2020 completion date, pushing it into new fiscal year. NPG from 501(c)(3), Citizens for Los Angeles Wildlife, (CLAW) submitted by Tony Tucci, Co-Director, to purchase two (2) Bushnell 30 MP Core Trail Cameras with SD Card and two (2) security boxes for purpose of documenting open space/wildlife in their habitat in Los Angeles, replacing two cameras in the Bel Air-Beverly Crest region. - 37. Westside Regional Alliance of Councils (WRAC) (Discussion & Possible Action, Letter or CIS Submission) WRAC met on June 17, 2020 and recommended the BABCNC consider the following motions:
 - a) <u>Possible Land Use Motion</u>: Whereas, the statewide Covid-19 emergency has reduced the action calendar time frame of the California State Legislature, and thus greatly reduced the ability of California's citizens to weigh in on legislation having to do with land use planning;
 - Whereas the proposed Atkins Housing Package of bills has not been sufficiently vetted for integration with previously approved Regional Housing Needs Assessment legislation, which modernized the methodology for anticipating growth in the state:
 - Whereas communities continue to urge greater accountability, fairness, transparency, and responsiveness from public officials in the area of land use planning;
 - Whereas the proposed Atkins Housing Package of bills has *not* been sufficiently vetted for growth induced impacts and substantial hidden state mandated costs upon:
 - Local General Plans and Community Plans;
 - Communities in environmentally sensitive areas such as High Fire Hazard zones; Coastal zones; Earthquake fault

zones and others as listed in the California Environmental Quality Act [CEQA];

- Traditionally underserved communities and the impact on displacement in those areas;
- Critical local infrastructures for the public health, welfare and safety;

BABCNC recommends a postponement of action on this suite of housing bills until such time as the previously enacted 2018 and 2019 housing legislation has been given a chance to increase housing production as promised. [This motion passed unanimously in WRAC, after substantive discussion and some amendment.]

<u>In addition</u>, per the recommendation of the Hillside Federation, the BABCNC urges you to factor the elevated risk to persons and property due to wildfire into your consideration of all measures intended to increase housing, and to protect residents from the unintended consequences of allowing increased development and residential density in very high fire hazard severity zones and wildland-urban interface/intermix area. (**Attachment F**)

b) <u>Discussion & Possible Motion</u>: BABCNC insists that Neighborhood Councils are not prohibited from communicating with non-City of Los Angeles government representatives and/or staff not with entities other than those within the City, regarding issues impacting their neighborhoods; and that Neighborhood Councils are free to discuss any issues of local concern. [Motion passed unanimously in WRAC.]

c) <u>WRAC Membership Dues</u>:

<u>Discussion & Possible Motion</u>: Support concept that each member organization contribute \$250 annually to cover WRAC expenses, including website design and hosting, event fees and other incidental operating expenses. [WRAC resolution passed unanimously after discussion in WRAC. The Chair will discuss NC payment with Raquel Beltran in an upcoming call (and beyond) in order to ensure that NCs can pay dues to their regional alliance. If need be, NCs will be asked to send a letter in support.]
