**1.** Call to Order & Roll Call (Quorum 15) – Robin Greenberg called the meeting together at 7:02 pm. Roll was called by Robert Ringler, with 21 board members present initially; Heather, Chuck & Gail joined minutes later; Kristie arrived at 7:08, Bob at 7:22 and Don at 7:46, for a total of 27 present and 6 absent.

### 4. <u>Public Comments</u>:

**Ellen Evans** related that traffic on Sunset Plaza has been detoured due to a project, along with other construction projects, parking creates a mess. People who live on Sunset Plaza sometimes can't get out for up to an hour. They're trying pause construction on the street. No department takes responsibility. She'd like PLU to take it up.

**Philip Enderwood** would like to have West Traffic LAPD look at the situation described by Ellen. Philip reported concern about the two shootings in Beverly Crest this morning in the Beverly Hills Post Office area, noting need to build stronger relationships with LAPD & balance police reforms with open communication. Residents are concerned; need to work harder to find innovative solutions. He announced his candidacy for a public safety liaison position on this board that he has worked to establish.

**Nickie Miner** related that the shooting took place houses away from her property and close to Bob, noting that people are invading the neighborhoods into wee hours of the morning, trashing the streets; transient people in high fire severity zones who are smoking cigarettes, and that there is nothing in place that is helpful.

**Irene Sandler** has been in touch with CD5 rep Jarrett & Shawn regarding issues through NextDoor. She opined that our streets are at the mercy of the developers, not for our citizenry, not available for emergencies; the health & safety of our residents are at stake, need a few committees meeting at the same time, because this cannot go on.

**Jamie Hall** thanked Irene as the one bus they have in Laurel Canyon from CSMC to Studio City, #281 was to be eliminated in the NextGen program, and after we let CM Ryu & CM Koretz know, it will not be eliminated. It will come once an hour. He expressed thanks to Irene and the council members.

**Chuck Maginnis** related that he supports Philip 100%; however, he has not floated establishing a public safety liaison to the EP committee yet. He hopes to have an EP meeting on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of next month. If the committee does not have someone to do minutes, they won't have a meeting.

### 5. <u>Representatives of Elected Officials & City Agencies</u>

### a) Janet Turner, Representative for California's 33rd District Congressman, Ted Lieu:

- The Congressman joined 26 members of Congress to call for an investigation that the Federal Government improperly denied aid to California wildfire victims.

- USPS: They passed <u>Delivering for America Act</u> on Saturday; will undo some things the Postal Inspector put into place and put 25 million dollars in but the Senate refused to take it up. The Congressman is fighting on this, bringing experts to see if any other way to attack this problem. Follow his Twitter.

- Send Janet a privacy release form if you have a specific problem for USPS to address.

- Voting: There will be poll voting for several days. If you mail in, do not forget to sign the envelope and do not vote for more than one person under the category with the exception of judges or ballot will be disqualified.

### b) Allison Towle, Representative for California 26th Senate District Senator, Ben Allen:

Majority of work focused on processing unemployment & disability claims due to loss of jobs due to COVID-19.
The Legislature took an unexpected break in March, resumed in May, recessed in July and just learned there was an additional outbreak in the State Senate. All laws have to be voted on by August 31<sup>st</sup>, and because of the positive test, leadership is looking to how to move forward. California legislature is in a bit of a quandary how to do work.
SB-1044 1<sup>st</sup> successful banning in the Assembly of use & sales of 'PFAS' chemicals found in fire foam retardants that make their way into our water supply; SB-54 bill on single-use plastic to be made recyclable or compostable; SB-45 Climate Adaptation Bond to reduce risk of wildfire, flood, sea level rise, drought. Briefly discussed housing bill.

### c) Erin Seinfeld, Representative for 3<sup>rd</sup> District County Supervisor, Sheila Kuehl:

- LA COVID Relief Fund, joint partnership with City, 3 million dollar contribution for nonprofits and small businesses, starting on Monday <a href="https://www.lacovidfund.org/">https://www.lacovidfund.org/</a>

- Voting: Everyone in California will get a mail in ballot. You can mail your ballot in or turn it in by dropping it off at a drop box location at various civic and community buildings throughout the County, at a Voting Center. They will be open 5 days. The County is using disaster service workers to help at vote centers. You can track your ballot. - d) **Brad Fingard, Representative for CD4 Council Member David Ryu** introduced himself, noting that he is covering for Madelynn Taras who is on sabbatical. He has been in touch with the party houses. Updates: 1) Council passed CM Ryu's option to incentivize work at home; 2) Today motion was introduced to expand drop off for ballots and to use safe facilities. 3) CM Ryu & Koretz introduced a resolution in opposition to SB-1120.
- e) Jarrett Thompson, Representative for CD5 Council Member Paul Koretz is working with Greg Martayan on the shooting at 2219 San Ysidro, and with Shawn Bayliss on the water main break on Sunset. LAPD has two additional party-house cars, are trying to beef up enforcement in light of the murder last night. Recommended attending Community-Police Advisory Board on September 2<sup>nd</sup>.

- Benedict Canyon resurfacing was postponed. Larry thanked Jarrett for resurfacing along Sepulveda.

f) Kevin Taylor is Mayor Eric Garcetti's new West Office Representative <u>kevin.taylor@lacity.org</u> 213-320-8201 - Kevin introduced himself as being a former NC member; appreciates what we are doing, e.g., upcoming blood drive and lawn signs to encourage people to wear masks.

  - a) Update/Report by Chair: On Tuesday August 11, 2020, the PLU Committee met on Zoom, and the following actions were recommended to the BABCNC board:
  - i. <u>Housing Bills Opposition</u>: <u>Motion</u>: To draft a letter/CIS opposing certain housing bills pending in the California Assembly and Senate on the grounds that increased density in very high fire hazard severity zones without concomitant improvements in infrastructure poses an undue risk to public health, safety and welfare. Further, many of the developments that the legislation would facilitate in hillside communities would result in the permanent loss of native habitat necessary for the survival of flora and fauna and accelerates climate change. Moreover, passage of such legislation is premature because past housing measures have yet to be fully implemented. Legislation to be opposed on these grounds includes Senate Bill 1120, Senate Bill 902 and Assembly Bill 3040. Moved in committee by Jamie; <u>seconded</u> by Bob; <u>13/0/0; passed</u>.

Currently the Department of Public Works does not even have an appeal process for permits/clearances that are issued which makes it extremely difficult (if not impossible) for citizens to get errors corrected when they are made. Moreover, BABCNC calls for more transparency and input in the appointment of commissioners to the Board of Building and Safety Commissioners. I FURTHER MOVE that the City Attorney be requested to draft an ordinance based on the deterrence tools recommendations by DBS, DCP, DWP, and HCID that can be used to hold property owners accountable for parties hosted at their properties that violate the County Public Health Order and put public health at risk during this COVID-19 pandemic. calendar days of such communication. If time is of the essence (i.e., subsequent action by public or private body or publication of news story) for a representative of the Board or Committee to inform such third party of its position on the matter, then such notice shall be immediate. Such Member may only express such contrary view when specifically qualifying such view as individual or personal, and not as a Member of the Board or Committee."
