Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to 1 minute per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.

AB 361 Updates: Public comment cannot be required to be submitted in advance of the meeting, only real-time public comment is required. If there are any broadcasting interruptions that prevent the public from observing or hearing the meeting, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned. If members of the public are unable to provide public comment or be heard due to issues within the Neighborhood Council's control, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned. Any messaging or virtual background behind a board member is in the control of that member in their personal capacity and does not reflect any formal position of the Bel Air-Beverly Crest Neighborhood Council or the City of Los Angeles.

- Since this is a new policy, expect to receive material on a rolling basis as we develop support tools and procedures to assist you with implementation of the policy and administration of your NC's digital accounts. If you have suggestions for support tools or mechanisms, please send them our way! We heard some great ones during this workshop which we are currently researching. As mentioned during the session, an FAQ compiling the questions and answers from all 3 sessions in this training series will be shared in early October, after the series is complete.
- Three suggestions for the board's consideration to prepare for when the Digital Communications Policy goes into effect this October 4. All 3 items will make your NC's digital account admin go more smoothly, and help prevent loss of accounts due to billing or lost login issues:
 - 1. **Set up a shared email address** to use for your login credentials and billing on your NC digital communications accounts. This is what is meant by an "Account

Administrator email address" in Section 6.1 of the policy. This could be an address that forwards to a recipient list (as your NC's EmpowerLA.org email address does, for example). Or it could be an address that multiple people have the login for, so they can access verifications or account notices sent to that inbox. Section 6.1 requires that this sort of shared email address be tied to all NC accounts wherever possible, to help prevent loss of account access if someone leaves the board or needs coverage for their admin role.

- 2. **Assign multiple account administrators.** Section 6.1 also recognizes that there are some platforms where these shared email addresses can't be used such as Facebook, where account admin must be tied to an individual administrator. In those cases, NCs should assign multiple administrators to their accounts on such platforms. Facilitating shared administrative access with shared email addresses and multiple admins ensures that NCs are safeguarded against permanent loss of digital accounts in which they've invested money and years of effort.
- 3. **Set a standing agenda item to discuss digital communications at your monthly board meeting.** This should cover content for your newsletter, social media, websites, and digital marketing, and also include discussion of account administrative needs and any billing for digital subscriptions and services, to ensure uninterrupted service.
