"While the Council appreciates that the community had a number of concerns about the Wildlife-Friendly Fencing standards in the previous draft of the ordinance, removal seems to significantly lessen the potential impact of the ordinance on wildlife connectivity. BABCNC would like to see the following added to the ordinance:

For lots greater than ½ an acre, perimeter fencing must be permeable to allow wildlife to pass through. Interior fencing may be impermeable."
