15. Fine Schedule / Protecting Street Trees / Administrative Citation Enforcement (ACE) Program

Discussion & Possible Motion: To support the motion in CF#23-0801 asking that the Council instruct the Bureau of Street Services (BSS) to report back within 30 calendar days from adoption of this motion on an administrative fine schedule for violations of LAMC 62.169(a), 62.171, or 62.174 commensurate with damages including but not limited to loss of shade, loss of carbon storage, increase to local average surface temperature of the street, decrease in local air quality, and tree species – and that the Council request the City Attorney, with the assistance of BSS, to include in the aforementioned report recommendations for the appropriate party to receive the citation and fines, payment plans or other provisions for a demonstrated inability to pay the levied fines, culturally competent education and outreach, and next steps to effectuate the proposed administrative fine schedule.

16. ACA 4 (Bryan) / Repeal Constitutional Voting Provisions / Disqualified Convicted Felons / State or Federal Prisons

4 (Bryan) / introduced August 2, 2023 (Harris-Dawson – Hernandez – Raman – Soto-Martinez) and referred to Rules, Elections & Intergovernmental Relations Committee, requesting that the City of Los Angeles include in its 2023-2024 State Legislative Program SUPPORT of ACA 4 (Bryan), which would repeal constitutional provisions that disqualify people convicted in State or federal prison from voting. <u>Discussion & Possible Motion</u>: To oppose the motion in <u>Council File# 23-0846</u> (Hutt – Hernandez – Soto-Martinez - Yaroslavsky) introduced August 15, 2023 and referred to the Trade, Travel and Tourism Committee, requesting the City Attorney to prepare and present an ordinance, similar to one enacted by San Francisco, which would ban cashless retail businesses in Los Angeles.

<u>Discussion & Possible Motion</u>: Advise City of Los Angeles regarding position on USDOT proposal to allow "flying taxis" aka Advanced Air Mobility (AAM) or Urban Air Mobility (UAM). (**Attachment D**)

19. Parking Space Replacement Policy <u>Possible Motion</u> (WRAC Mobility & Transportation Committee (MTC)

The BABCNC, a member of the Westside Regional Alliance of Councils, is concerned about the passage of **CF 23-0360**, which nullifies Sections 22.482(a) and 22.602 of the Administrative Code and changes the parking space replacement policy when LADOT parking facilities with spaces greater than 25 are transferred to the Housing Department for redevelopment as affordable or supportive housing.

BABCNC is sensitive to how difficult it can be to develop affordable and supportive housing in Los Angeles. We recognize there is a shortage of affordable and supportive housing and believe that Los Angeles would benefit from making it easier to build such housing.

Until now, when LADOT-managed parking facilities have been redeveloped, all the parking spaces had to be replaced, increasing the cost of the development. With the passage of CF 23-0360, the spaces will no longer be required to be replaced.

However, we believe that the needs of small businesses, including the need for parking for their customers, have not been adequately considered with the

nullification of Administrative Code Sections 22.482(a) and 22.602 and establishment of the new parking space replacement policy.

Therefore, we respectfully request that Councilmembers representing WRAC member councils who are also members of the City Council Transportation Committee — Council-members Park, Yaroslavsky, Raman and/or Hutt — bring a motion in Los Angeles City Council forthwith to further amend the Administrative Code to include concessions for small businesses by replacing the new parking space development footprint. The City should determine how much parking to replace by using a sliding scale for parking replacement based on prior utilization, as well as the availability of nearby public parking, rather than never requiring any replacement.
