Subject: Urgent Safety Concerns: Milken Scenario 1 Evacuation & Community Impact

Dear BABCNC Board,

Based on the submitted Milken Project presentation to the BABCNC committee, we would like to address a few vulnerabilities in their evacuation plan for Scenario #1. While Milken has indicated that they are addressing safety concerns through student drills, these measures fail to account for the complex external reality of a hypothetical wildfire evacuation and or emergency. .

Our review finds that the current plan presents significant risks not only to the students but to the entire Bel Air community for the following reasons:

- **Regional Gridlock and Overlapping Evacuations:** The plan to move all vehicles toward Mulholland Drive between 9:55 am and 10:10 am does not

account for Stephen S. Wise Temple and School, which shares the same emergency route. A simultaneous evacuation of both large institutions onto Mulholland would lead to total traffic paralysis.

- **Conflicting Traffic Flows:** While Milken students are attempting to exit at 9:55 am, panicked parents from across the city will likely be driving *toward* the school and Stephen S. Wise to retrieve their children. This "clash" of incoming and outgoing traffic on narrow hillside roads creates a high probability of road blockage for emergency fire apparatus.
- **Vulnerable Neighbor Impact:** The Casiano Road corridor includes many elderly residents who may move more slowly or require assistance. A sudden surge of dozens of student-driven vehicles—each carrying multiple passengers—increases the risk of accidents with panicked neighbors who are also attempting to flee.
- **Limitations of Drills and Waivers:** While students may practice the 9:35 am assembly, a drill cannot simulate the presence of civilian traffic, the arrival of frantic parents, or the reduced visibility caused by smoke.
- **Resource Strain:** The plan relies on Security personnel to manage traffic on Casiano Road starting at 9:40 am. However, if the road is blocked by parents or neighbors, these personnel will be unable to maintain the 10:10 am "all-clear" timeline, potentially leaving students stranded in a high-fire-risk zone.

We strongly urge the BABCNC to request a joint evacuation study between Milken, Stephen S. Wise, and local law enforcement to address these cumulative impacts on the community's safety.
