Every person wishing to address the Board by telephone must dial **(669) 900-6833 or (888) 475 4499**, enter **897 4708 2329 & press #** When prompted by the presiding officer to provide public input at the Board meeting, the public will be requested to dial \*9 or use the Raise Hand option to address the Board on any agenda item before the Board takes an action on an item. Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Committee is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to one (1) minute per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(3).

The legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(4).

Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that

requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(5),

A legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to paragraph (5), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6(A),

A legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to paragraph (5), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6)(B).

**6. Update, Discussion & Possible Action on Issues Raised at the November & December 2025 Traffic Committee meetings to include:**

- **San Ysidro Drive Traffic Issue.** Since the last meeting, BABCNC sent a letter to CD5 Councilwoman Katy Yaroslavsky and Staff regarding traffic and disturbance issues arising from the use of San Ysidro Drive as an access for construction vehicles and workers for Beverly Park Estates, requesting a solution.
- **Beverly Glen Safety and Speed Improvement Project:** Jarrett Thompson gave an update in his written report on December 11, 2025, regarding new traffic calming improvements which were being evaluated for issues requiring correction. He also noted that increased LAPD enforcement was sought at Mulholland and Nicada at that time.

Traffic Committee Deputy Chair Dave Christensen explained at the 12/11/2025 meeting that the Beverly Glen Safety and Speed Improvement Project — which resulted in new signage restricting left turns at Nicada Drive / Beverly Glen Boulevard and at Nicada / Mulholland Drive — appeared abruptly to many residents, though CD5 reported it had been in development for five to six years. He noted that CD5 Transportation Deputy Thompson asked for approximately six weeks of community experience with the changes before the committee formally responds. The matter was discussed at the December 11<sup>th</sup> meeting, and public comment was provided by Stakeholder, David Van Iderstine (Bel Air Glen HOA) who gave detailed context that the cut-through route — Beverly Glen, turn onto Nicada, left on Woodwardia, returning to Beverly Glen via Angelo Drive — was prohibited by new signage but enforcement hadn't started. Waze had incorporated the new restrictions, but compliance of Apple Maps and Google Maps was unknown.
- **Mulholland and Nicada Signage / Proposed Stop Sign**
  - (1) Stakeholder Dr. Pierson noted that the new signage states no left turn between 4pm and 7pm, however is ineffective secondary to no enforcement.
  - (2) Stakeholder Dr. Pierson has previously proposed CD5 have a temporary trial of a stop sign on Mulholland at the West Corner of Nicada (acts like a three-way stop) for eastbound traffic at Nicada and had requested this from Councilmember Yaroslavsky.
- **Restriction on Parking on Mulholland Drive Between Beverly Glen and Nicada Drive** – The BABCNC sent a letter on March 11, 2025, to CD4 and CD5, noting that at the September 25, 2025 (sic) [2024] meeting, the Board of BABCNC voted 20-0-1 to request, consistent with the design standards for Mulholland Drive, that “No Parking” signs be installed on Mulholland between Beverly Glen and Nicada... in the interest of public safety (fire risk from vehicles parked on dry grass and weeds) as well as public enjoyment of a designated scenic highway.
- **Shield Fences Design Standards:** Sidney Liss’s report of 12/11/2025 requested examples of the fences in question (on the north side of Mulholland off Nicada) and mentioned that the office may be able to pursue enforcement of Specific Plan Design standards if violations are found.
- **AB 645 Speed Safety System:** LADOT is actively working on this. See link for camera locations: <https://ladot.lacity.gov/speed-safety-system#where> – Aaron Lawrence

- **Water on Laurel Canyon Boulevard:** Sidney Liss's 12/11/2025 report on the issue noted that engineers would be evaluating this.
