Every person wishing to address the Board by telephone must dial **(669) 900-6833 or (888) 475 4499, then enter 832 7016 5200 & press # to join the meeting.** When prompted by the presiding officer to provide public input at the Board meeting, the public will be requested to dial *9 or use the Raise Hand option to address the Board on any agenda item before the Board takes an action on an item. Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Committee is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to one (1) minute per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible

legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(3).

The legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(4).

Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(5),

A legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to paragraph (5), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6(A)),

A legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to paragraph (5), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6)(B).

6. **San Ysidro Drive & Mulholland Drive; Beverly Park Estates Construction Traffic**

Discussion and Possible Motion: That BABCNC escalate its previous request by directing specific City departments to exercise existing permitting and emergency-access authority over construction activity at Beverly Park Estates, and by requesting a written response on a fixed timeline.

BACKGROUND: The Board has further received reports from its Traffic Committee, and from residents, that construction-related heavy trucks have caused measurable damage to San Ysidro Drive's pavement; that a vehicle weight-restriction sign formerly posted at the base of San Ysidro Drive is no longer present; and that Beverly Park-affiliated construction workers are occupying resident street parking on San Ysidro Drive and Summit Ridge for the full workday, displacing residents, guests, and service vehicles.

MOTION: That the Bel Air–Beverly Crest Neighborhood Council:

1. Reaffirms its January 28, 2026 position that the City must resolve construction-related traffic and access impacts on both San Ysidro Drive and Mulholland Drive, and that no resolution that simply displaces the burden from one public street to the other will be considered acceptable or responsive.
2. Requests that the Los Angeles Fire Department provide a written assessment, within 45 days, of whether the documented daily obstruction of San Ysidro Drive — a narrow hillside street with no secondary emergency egress, located within a Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zone — constitutes an impairment of emergency vehicle access under LAFD's operational access standards and what authority LAFD has to require the obstruction be cleared.
3. Requests that the Los Angeles Department of Building and Safety, in coordination with LADOT, condition all active and future building permits for construction projects within Beverly Park Estates on a unified Construction Traffic Management Plan covering the development as a whole — not approved project-by-project in isolation — that prohibits the staging, queuing, or idling of construction vehicles and workers on San Ysidro Drive or Mulholland Drive, and that designates compliant staging areas within Beverly Park Estates' own private property.
4. Requests that LADOT determine whether San Ysidro Drive previously carried a posted vehicle weight restriction; if so, why it was removed; and whether reinstatement and enforcement of a weight restriction limiting San Ysidro Drive to vehicles consistent with its residential character is warranted and available as an immediate measure, independent of the broader haul-route question.
5. Requests that LADOT increase routine enforcement of existing vehicle code violations on San Ysidro Drive and Summit Ridge, including blocked driveways, illegal parking, and improper waste disposal, as an immediate measure pending resolution of on-site parking for construction at Beverly Park Estates.
6. Requests that Council District 5 report back to BABCNC, in writing, no later than the Board's next regular meeting following the LAFD and LADBS responses above, with

a specific status update including: (a) the substance of any legal guidance received from the City Attorney’s office regarding the City’s authority described in Items 2 and 3 above; (b) a timeline for implementation of any interim measure, including the scheduled gate-access system previously proposed by this Board’s Traffic Committee in December 2025; and (c) if no enforceable mechanism is identified, an explanation of what additional City Council action, including a formal Motion directing the relevant departments, would be required to obtain one.

7. Directs the President to transmit this motion directly to Councilmember Katy Yaroslavsky, City Attorney Hydee Feldstein Soto, Mayor Karen Bass, the LAFD Fire Marshal, and the General Managers of LADBS and LADOT, in addition to CD5 staff, so that this Board's request is a matter of direct record with all responsible parties.

New Business

7. **Budget Committee Motion / Budget FY 2026-2027**
Discussion and Possible Motion to approve of the Draft Budget “Administrative Packet” for FY 2026-2027 (**Attachment E**) and to request that the BABCNC write a letter to the city that we would like the Board to be able to use the city emails. Motion recommended by the Budget and Finance Committee 6-0-0.
8. **Traffic Committee Motion / Mulholland and Nicada Proposed Stop Sign**
Discussion and Possible Motion to request that the appropriate authority install a temporary stop sign on the southwest corner of Mulholland Drive at Nicada Drive (at the location of the former traffic signal) on a trial basis. Motion recommended by Traffic Committee 8-3-0.

BACKGROUND: On March 26, 2025, the Board passed a motion (22-1-1) requesting that LADOT and Council Districts 4 and 5 investigate the feasibility of, and install, a stop sign or traffic signal at Nicada Drive and Mulholland Drive, citing two recent motor vehicle accidents at the location. On October 22, 2025, a third serious accident occurred at this intersection, in which a vehicle went through the guardrail and over the cliff. At its June 17, 2026 meeting, the Traffic Committee was informed by CD5 Transportation Deputy Jarrett Thompson that LADOT has previously reviewed this location and declined to install a stop sign, citing traffic flow concerns, and was advised that BABCNC could submit a formal letter requesting LADOT reinvestigate. The Traffic Committee subsequently voted to request a temporary trial stop sign at this location. The Board now considers a renewed, written request to LADOT.

9. **City of Los Angeles Charter Reform**
Discussion and Possible Motion to comment on the elements of charter reform that the City Council voted to put on the ballot.

BACKGROUND: On June 17, 2026, the City Council voted to advance a package of charter amendments to the November 3, 2026 ballot, including doubling Recreation and Parks Department funding and allowing noncitizen voting in certain local elections, while deferring council expansion, ranked-choice voting, voting age reduction, and the city attorney role split to a new ad hoc Council committee targeting a 2028 ballot. The City Attorney's Office is now drafting official ballot language, with a final Council vote expected in the coming weeks.
